Garbage Reminders

- Any material that prevents the lid of the toter cart from closing flat is considered excess. If you have excess garbage, your toter cart may not be emptied.
- Material placed in the toter cart must be contained in a bag or box.
- Toter carts that are not properly placed at the curb will not be emptied and is the responsibility of the property owner.
- The garbage toter must be at the curb by 7:00 am on collection day to ensure pick-up that week.
- Litter that is created as a result of crows or small animals ripping garbage bags open is the responsibility of the owner to clean up.
- Garbage bags cannot weigh more than 20 kg (44 lbs.) each.
- Large items (ie, mattresses, box springs, furniture) and white goods (ie household appliances) are not accepted at the curb by the waste truck.
- E-waste, tires and scrap metal items are also not accepted at the curb.

Residential Collection Limits

- The garbage limit per week is one 95-gallon toter cart (lid closed flat) or any combination of up to four regular-size garbage bags, bundles of brush, bulk items and/or regular-size bags of yard waste.
- Bundles of brush must be tied securely weighing no more than 20 kg (44 lbs.) and must fit inside the toter cart.
- One 95-gallon toter cart is equivalent to four garbage bags.
- All items in excess of the limit, not properly contained or not in an approved container will be left at the curb. Items left at the curb are the responsibility of the owner to remove/clean up.

Non-Collectible Garbage

- Toter carts with excess garbage (ie, lid does not close flat)
- Clippings/branches from trees/shrubs that are placed outside the toter cart
- Manufacturing or industrial waste
- Explosives and highly flammable or volatile substances
- Liquid or gaseous waste, caustics and acids
- Poisons, pesticides and herbicides, radioactive material
- Septic tank materials, raw sewage, sludge and industrially processed sludge
- Infected materials including dressings and bandages
- Syringes/needles
- Carcasses or parts thereof of any animal or other creature, save for bona fide kitchen and table waste
- Live animals or birds
- Hay, straw and manure
- Any materials which have become frozen to a container and cannot be removed by shaking or without breaking the container
- Broken plaster, railroad ties, pallets, lumber or other waste resulting from the construction, alteration, repair, demolition or removal of any building or structure
- Discarded tires with or without rims, trucks, automobiles and other vehicles and any parts
- Tree trunks, stumps, loose leaves or branches, sod or fill of any kind
- Household paints, solvents
- Non-prescribed containers, such as 45-gallon drums and loose grocery/kitchen catcher bags
- White goods/scrap metal
- E-Waste (i.e., computers, monitors, cameras, fax machines, printers, etc.)
